- Your child is invited to visit Holy Trinity School for familiarisation on **9th July and 15th July 1.30 -2.30pm**
- Staff will contact your child's pre-school setting this term
- Mrs Tomes/Mrs Lawrence will offer a home visit either **30th June or 1st July** – sign up for a 20 min slot
- In September, first week will be **half days. On Wednesday 2nd and Thursday 3rd** 15 children will attend each session (either 8.30 – 11.30 or 1 – 3.15pm) - we'll let you know which slot.
- On **Friday 4th September** all children will be in 8.30 – 12.30 and will have lunch.
- From **Monday 7th September**, all children will be in full time 8.45 until 3.15pm.

Home Visits

Tuesday 30th June and Wednesday 1st July

- A chance to talk about the move to Holy Trinity and to ask questions- if you have concerns about the transition, have something confidential or medical to talk to us about or are new to the school.
- Sign up sheet on the table for 20 min slot.
- The aim is to make the transition a positive and enjoyable experience.
- It is significant for the children, lots talk about 'when you came to my house.'

First Days

School starts between 8.30 and 8.45am

Things to bring

- Named water bottle
- Book bags
- Packed lunch if you not having school dinners.
- First week (2nd, 3rd and 4th September) there will be a morning session – we will let you know which group your child is in. Pick up from Church Road gate.

First Week

Things to bring

- Wellingtons
- Water bottles
- PE kits won't be needed for the first few weeks. Although sometimes useful to have a change of clothes in school.
- No need to bring in pencil cases.
- No need to bring in toys- we have lots!



Communication

Do come and see us at the end of the day if you have any concerns, or make an appointment to see us. First thing in the morning, we are trying to settle the children so try to keep conversations short.

Focus on:

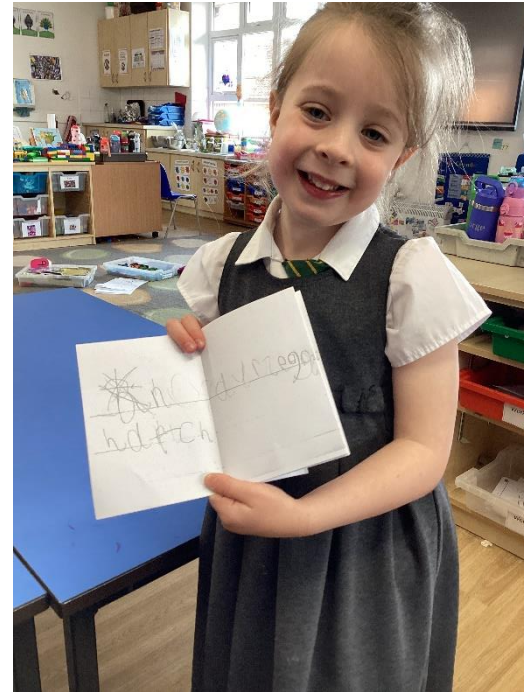
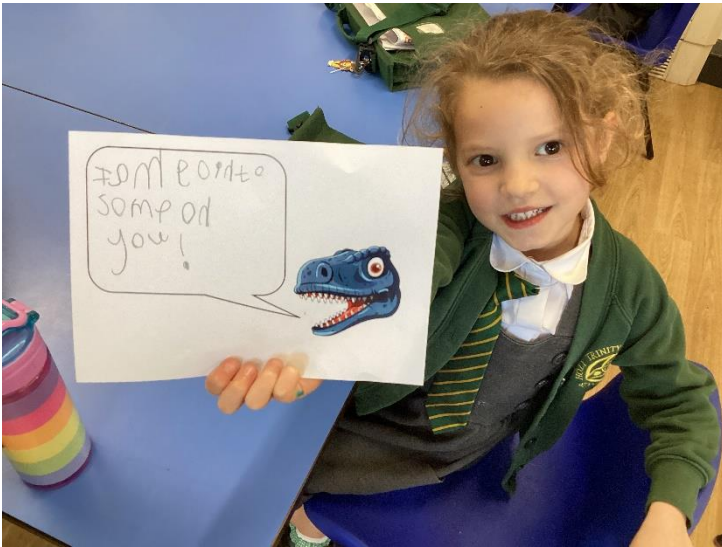
- Supporting everyone to try and enable them to gain their Early Learning Goals.
