SRMSAT Checklist

School resource management self-assessment checklist

The checklist asks a number of questions of trust boards in six areas of resource management to help provide assurance that resources are being managed effectively.

The 2019/20 self-assessment tool return was due on 14 November 2019 and submitted using an online form. This downloaded form can be used to prepare for the return or to assess use of resources at various points throughout the year.

The checklist should be completed at academy trust level.

The dashboard data should be completed at school level. Sixth form colleges do not need to complete the dashboard.

Schools and trusts should use the most up to date data available to them, and not rely on lagged published data.

Complete all highlighted cells.

Either input the school's percentages and ratios directly, or complete the [Optional - input raw data](#) form with spending information and school characteristics. The percentages and ratios in the dashboard will then auto-calculate.

School resource management: top 10 planning checks for governors

School and academy governors can explore these questions to help schools manage their resources and money efficiently.



- 1. Staff pay as percentage of total expenditure
- 2. Average teacher cost
- 3. Pupil-to-teacher ratio (PTR)
- 4. Class sizes
- 5. Teacher contact ratio
- 6. Proportion of budget spent on the leadership team
- 7. 3 to 5 year budget projections
- 8. Spend per pupil for non-pay expenditure lines compared to similar schools
- 9. School improvement plan priorities and the relative cost of options
- 10. List of contracts with costs and renewal dates
