More support for working parents -do feel my child misses out & fear this could get worse as she progresses through school (e.g. transport to sports events / class show & tell - Imagine how it feels for a child whose parents can't come (distressing!!). Strong opinions here!!

Helping reception children in the playground – buddies from older years.

Sport! Feel it is so important to development / sense of community – therefore needs prioritised

Sports leader (school or cluster) required. Key sports co-ordinator cannot be expected to organise a sport curriculum / calendar whilst also being an outstanding teacher.

Promote areas to parents

Earlier notice of events e.g. dress up days - & especially ones where parents are invited (e.g. come & see, sports day) so parents who work can arrange time off after school clubs + more places & open until 6pm

More one to one reading

Sport Cluster schools to communicate & plan ahead. More team fixtures + better notice to parent. Request for players 2 days – 1 week before is not appropriate. If interest by kids is high organisers should address event format + accommodate all children. Not who can get the form in 1st.. kids with working families loose out.
