

Instrument of government

1. The name of the school is Holy Trinity Church of England Primary School Sunningdale.
2. The school is a Voluntary Aided school.
3. The name of the governing body is "The Governing Body of Holy Trinity Church of England Primary School, Sunningdale".
4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. Two parent governors
 - b. One Local Authority governor
 - c. One staff governor
 - d. One head teacher
 - e. Seven foundation governors
5. The total number of governors shall be 12 except that, at any time when the head teacher has given written notice to the clerk to the governors that he/she chooses not to be a governor, the total shall be 11.
6. Two foundation governors shall be appointed by the Oxford Diocesan Board of Education.
7. Four foundation governors shall be appointed by the Parochial Church Council of Holy Trinity Church Sunningdale.
8. a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio:

The Vicar of Sunningdale.

 - b) The Archdeacon of Berkshire shall appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in a) above in the event that that ex officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to be a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21(1) of the Regulations, or there is a vacancy in the office named in a) above.
 - c) The Archdeacon of Berkshire shall be entitled to request the removal of the ex officio foundation governor named in a) above and to appoint a substitute foundation governor.
9. The School has a Trust Deed dated 25 June 1842. The first pupils were enrolled in 1842.

10. The school's Ethos Statement is:

Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan levels. The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

11. This instrument of government comes into effect on 1st September 2015

12. This instrument was made by order of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead Authority on 1st June 2015

13. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), any trustees and the Oxford Diocesan Board of Education.
