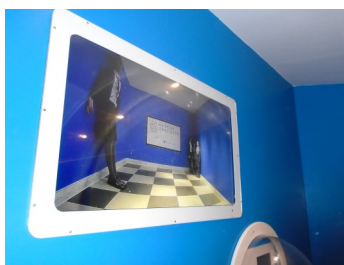

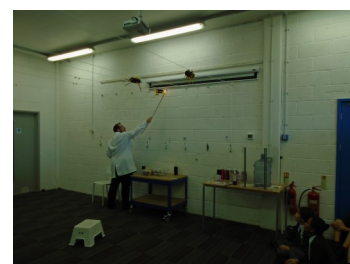

Balfour Beatty Visit KS1

A team of six from Balfour Beatty visited Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 yesterday morning for an exciting morning about construction. What do the children say about it?

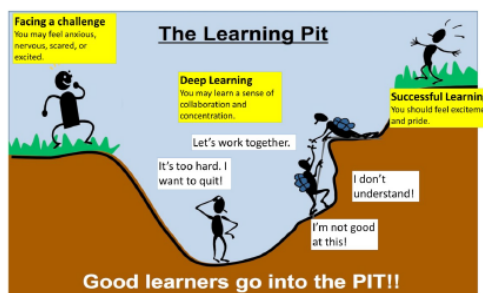
It's made me determined to keep going and not give up.

Film night - 12th December - this event will go online on Classlist after the fair. The film will be Incredibles 2.

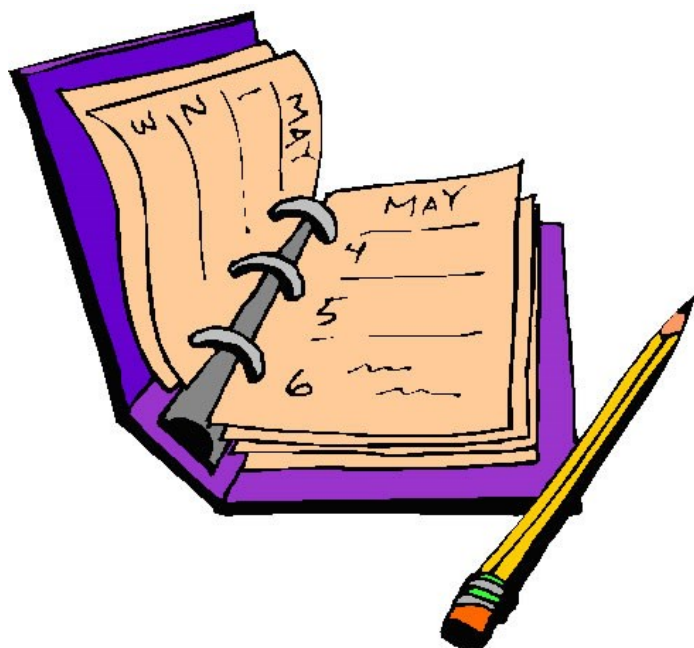

First World War Centenary Commemoration

Victory Park, Addlestone

On the eve of the Armistice help us commemorate the Borough's Fallen. Please come along to Victory Park **between 2.30 pm and 3.30 pm** and help us light **848** candles - one for each Borough resident who died during the **1914-1918** war. The candles, in poppy decorated jam jars created by local school children, will be positioned around the memorial park gates.

At 3.30 pm the Mayor of Runnymede will dedicate a new memorial bench and tree, followed by a short service of remembrance led by Rev. Ben Beecroft, Vicar of St. Paul's Church.
