Year 6 Visit Brookwood Military Cemetery

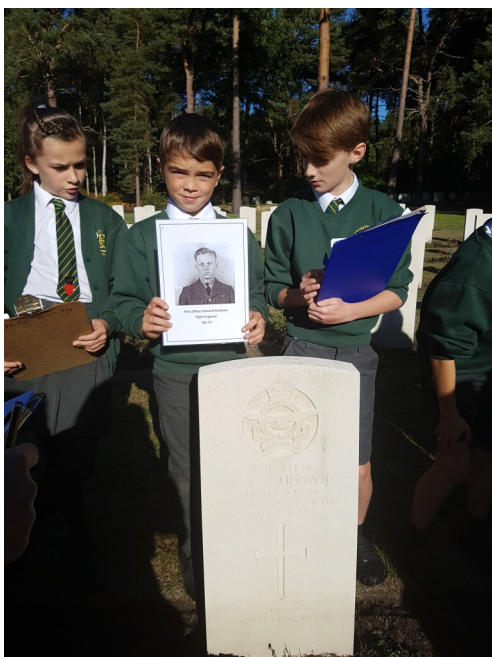
The Year 6 school trip to Brookwood Military Cemetery was without a shadow of a doubt a memorable one....

When we arrived, we set ourselves up in partners armed with clipboards and pencils ready to sketch, make notes, write questions and find answers. We then set off on our tour with Fiona from the War Graves Commission. Fiona took us around the cemetery looking at the different graves and searching for similarities and differences. We looked at the shape of the headstones, the symbols on them and also the inscriptions. We thought about the different countries which fought in both world wars and found out that the cemetery honours men and women from all countries on either side.

We were particularly interested to learn about Private Thomas Knowles from South Africa. At 15 years old, he is the youngest casualty in the cemetery. There were several other stories about the bravery of both men and women who fought for their country and cared for other people.

We would like to thank Mrs Neale, Mrs Marriner, Mrs Hunter, Mrs Stanley and Mrs Johnstone for taking us on the trip. We would also like to thank Mrs Jans and Mrs Poulter for taking us. If you are interested in world history and have never been before, we really recommend the cemetery as a place to visit.

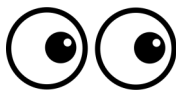

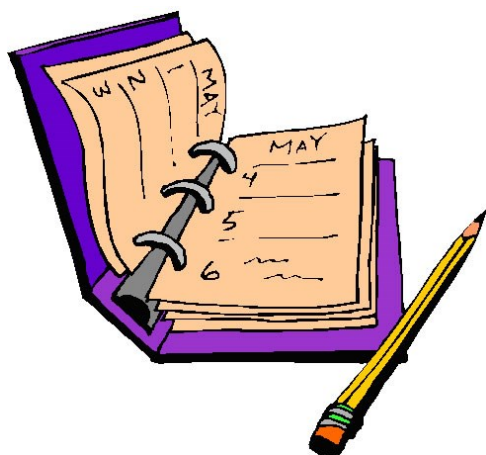
