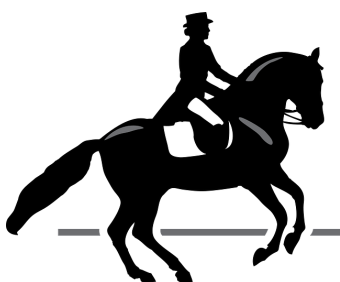

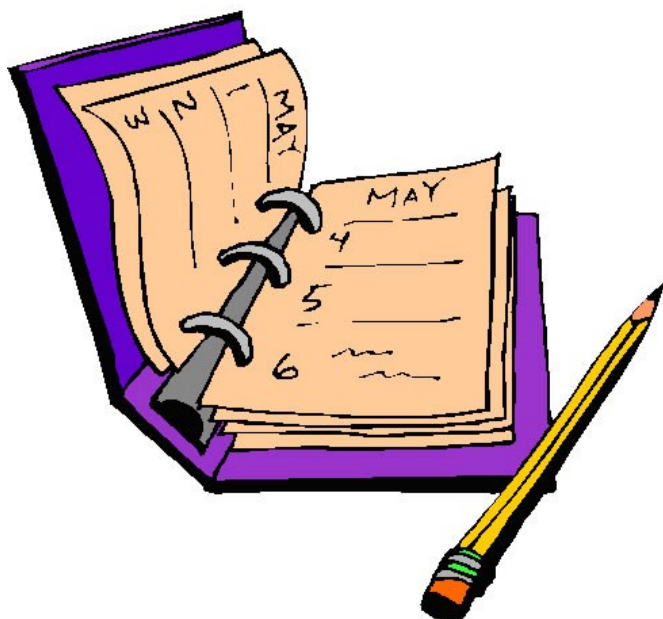
In the office we have a fitness tracker found today (not as pictured—you'll need to tell me the colour) and a silver purse which we've had for some time. Are they yours?
