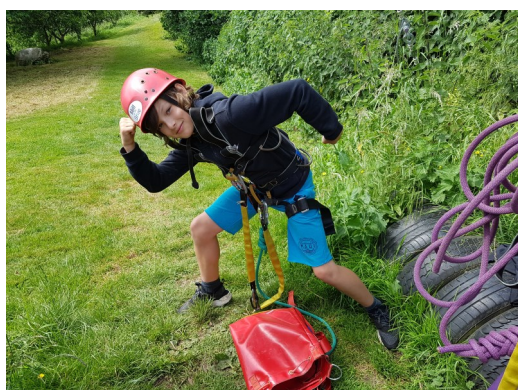

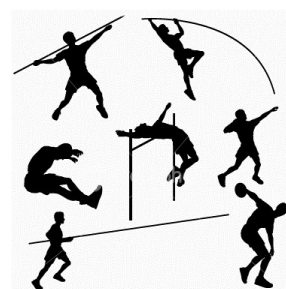

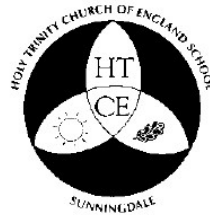

All pupils:

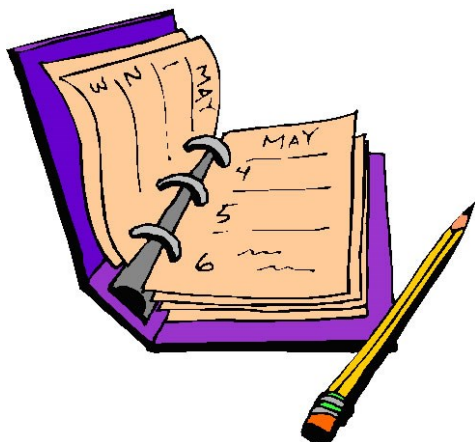
- 9.30am: Sports Day – Families welcome
