Club Bookings

It is crucial that you book and pay for your children to attend any after school clubs well in advance of them turning up. We've had numerous children turning up with kit for clubs and attending these without being booked on. This presents several problems:

Safeguarding—the club don't have your child's name on the register so the teacher is not expecting to hand the child over to the club.

Safeguarding—the club leader will not have your emergency contact details with them.

Safeguarding and Health and Safety—the club leader will not have details of your child's medical needs.

Please don't assume that the club leader will know these things if your child has been to the club in a previous term. Club leaders often change and they will be carrying the register only of those children booked in (and not their organisation's database of contacts) Many thanks for your co-operation with this.

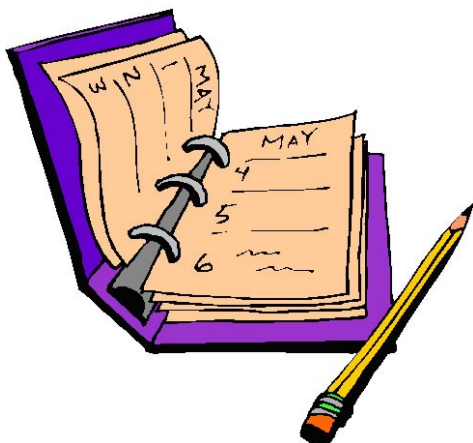
