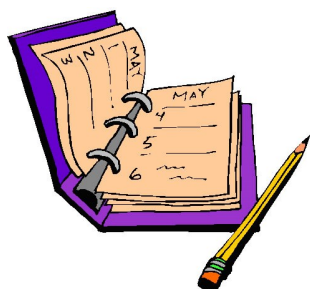

Is your child protected against MMR?

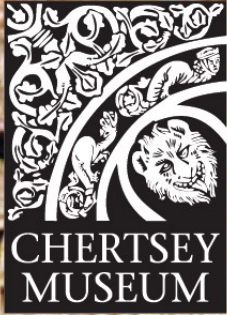
