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Y4 End of Year reports

Dear Parents and Carers,

Please find attached your child's end of year report.

This includes Teacher Assessment information about how your child has achieved in each subject. For the **Core Subjects** (English, Maths, Science and RE) the following table explains the colour coding:

Pupil's Attainment (Core Subjects)
Pupils who are not yet working on the objectives linked to their year group.
Working towards age related expectation
Working at age related expectation
Working at greater depth within age related expectation
Working at greater depth within age related expectation and beyond

"Age related expectation" is the expected level for the child's age based on national averages/national curriculum expectations.

For the **Foundation Subjects** (Art, Computing, Design Technology, Geography, History, Music, PE and Spanish for KS2), your child has been assessed to have either 'met age expectations', or 'not yet met age expectations'. Again, this is based on the national curriculum objectives and expectations for their year group.

Pupil's Attainment in Foundation Subjects: 'Met age expectation' or 'Not yet met age expectation'.

In previous years, your child may have been assessed as working at 'greater depth' in foundation subjects. The changes made this year as described above reflect recommended national practice. So please don't be alarmed by the change. It simply means the band to assess pupils working at greater depth within foundation subjects has been removed.

In Year 4, all children take a statutory **Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)**. The purpose of this is to determine whether they can recall their times tables fluently. There are 25 questions, and we consider a score of 20 or above to be a good score. You'll find your child's score on their report.
