

## THE 1842 TRUST DEED – SUNNINGDALE ---

The Master Fellows & Scholars of St John's College Cambridge and The Minister & Churchwardens of Sunningdale (Berks) --- Whereas the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of St John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge within the authority of an Act passed in the fourth and fifth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intituled an Act for affording further facilities for the conveyance and endowment of sites for Schools do hereby freely and voluntarily and without any valuable consideration grant and convey to the Minister and Churchwardens of the District of Sunningdale and their Successors All that piece or parcel of Land bounded on the north by a Road known by the name of the Broomhill Road and on the east by a Road leading from Sunninghill to Broomhall Green and on the south and west by the Lands of the said College containing by admeasurement one rood and sixteen perches as the same are shewn in the plan hereunto annexed And all our right title and interest in ---

The same premises To hold the same unto the use of the said Minister and Churchwardens and their successors for the purposes of the said Act And upon trust to permit the said premises and all buildings thereon erected to be for ever thereafter appropriated and used as and for a School for the Education of Children and Adults or Children only of the poorer classes of and in the said District of Sunningdale and as a residence for the School master or Mistress and for no other purpose whatever said School shall always be conducted upon the principles of the Incorporated National Society for promoting the Education of the Poor in the Principles of the Established Church and shall be under the general management and control of the Committee for the time being of the Subscribers to the said School and shall be at all times open to the inspection of the Inspectors for the time being appointed or to be appointed in conformity with the Order in Council bearing date the tenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty (1840) In witness whereof the said Master Fellows and Scholars have caused the Common Seal of their said College to be hereunto affixed this thirtieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two.

Master of the said College and acknowledged the deed aforesaid and all was truly sealed delivered and executed and subscribed in form above written And also the Deed aforesaid was stamped according to the tenor of the statutes made for that purpose.
