- ◇ Christians believe God is omnipotent, omniscient and eternal.
- ◇ God is loving and holy
- ◇ Christians believe Jesus is one of the three persons of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- ◇ God the Father sent His Son to save His people
- ◇ The life, death and resurrection of Jesus was planned by God to restore the relationship between humans and God..
- ◇ Christians see Jesus as their Saviour.

Key Skills Taught

Investigate: ask relevant questions; know how to use different types of sources as a way of gathering information.

Empathise: consider the thoughts, feelings, attitudes, beliefs and values of others; identify feelings such as love, wonder, forgiveness and sorrow ; see the world through others eyes.

Express: explain concepts and practices, interpret symbols and respond through a range of media.

VOCABULARY

Restoration: returning something to what it was before

Foundation: an underlying basis or principle

parable: an earthly story with a heavenly meaning

parallels: what things are the same?

denial: saying something is not true.

sacrament: a religious ceremony or ritual.

Ethical dilemma: a moral choice has to be made between right and wrong.



Key Knowledge Taught: by the end of the unit, pupils are expected to know that:

- The good news is not just about setting an example for good behaviour and challenging bad behaviour: it is that Jesus offers a way to heal the damage done by human sin.
- Christians see that Jesus' teachings and example cut across expectations - the Sermon on the Mount is an example of this, where Jesus' values favour serving the weak and vulnerable, not making people comfortable.
- Christians believe that they should bring this good news to life in the world in different ways, within their church family, in their personal lives, with family, with their neighbours, in the local, national and global community
