- Christians see Jesus as their Saviour.

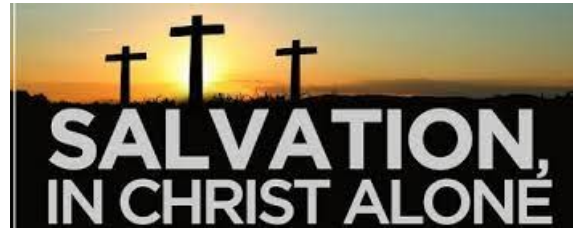
Key Questions

Key Skills Taught

Investigate: ask relevant questions; know how to use different types of sources as a way of gathering information.

Empathise: consider the thoughts, feelings, attitudes, beliefs and values of others; identify feelings such as love, wonder, forgiveness and sorrow ; see the world through others eyes.

Express: explain concepts and practices, interpret symbols and respond through a range of media.

VOCABULARY

Sacrifice: A decision to release feelings of anger or resentment towards a person who has harmed you.

The Last Supper: The last meal eaten by Jesus with his disciples before his death.

Communion/Eucharist: Sharing of bread (body) and wine (blood) to symbolise Jesus' sacrifice

Mass: An act of worship

Resurrection: Rising of Christ from the dead.

Martyr: A person who is killed for one's beliefs.

Corinthians: Letters of St Paul in the New Testament of the Bible

Salvation: God's grace. A gift of freedom from our sins that Jesus made possible by his death and resurrection.

Incarnation: 'Made Flesh' God's human form Jesus - God the Son.

Key Knowledge Taught: *by the end of the unit, pupils are expected to know that/be able to:*

- Outline the timeline of The Big Story of the bible explaining how incarnation and salvation fit.
- Explain what Christians mean when they say Jesus' death was a sacrifice using theological terms.
- Salvation includes the ongoing restoration of humans' relationship with God
- Suggest meanings for the narratives of Jesus' death and resurrection and how it was 'for us'.
- Make connections between the Christian belief of Jesus' death as a sacrifice and how Christians celebrate Holy Communion.
