Key Skills Taught

Investigate: ask relevant questions; know how to use different types of sources as a way of gathering information.

Empathise: consider the thoughts, feelings, attitudes, beliefs and values of others; identify feelings such as love, wonder, forgiveness and sorrow ; see the world through others eyes.

Express: explain concepts and practices, interpret symbols and respond through a range of media.

VOCABULARY

Gospel: The Good News – the teachings of Jesus.

Parable: A story that Jesus told to teach people a moral lesson.

Neighbour: A person near to you

Disciple: A follower of Jesus.

Forgiveness: To accept another's negative action and move on without seeking revenge.

Charity: To give away your time or money to support others.

Teaching: Lessons through story, song and images

Miracles: A remarkable event that can't be explained.

Key Knowledge Taught: *by the end of the unit, pupils are expected to know/be able to:*

- Christians believe Jesus challenges everyone about how to live — he sets the example for loving God and your neighbour, putting others first.
- Jesus shows love and forgiveness to unlikely people.
- Christians try to be like Jesus — they want to know him better and better.
- Christians try to put his teaching and example into practice in lots of ways, from church worship to social justice.
