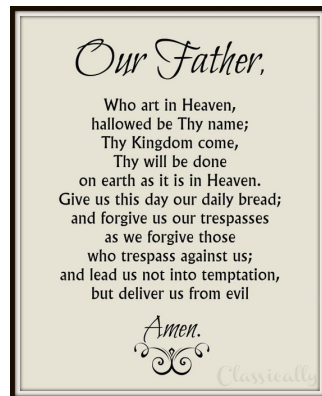


Prior Learning

Key Skills Taught

Investigate: ask relevant questions; know how to use different types of sources as a way of gathering information.

Empathise: consider the thoughts, feelings, attitudes, beliefs and values of others; identify feelings such as love, wonder, forgiveness and sorrow; see the world through others eyes.

Express: explain concepts and practices, interpret symbols and respond through a range of media.

VOCABULARY

Forgiveness: A decision to release feelings of anger or resentment towards a person who has harmed you.

Salvation: God's grace. A gift of freedom from our sins that Jesus made possible by his death and resurrection.

The Lord's Prayer: Also known as the Our Father. A prayer of forgiveness taught by Jesus.

The Last Supper: The last meal eaten by Jesus with his disciples before his death.

Peter: One of Jesus' disciples who denied him three times.



Key Knowledge Taught: by the end of the unit, pupils are expected to know/be able to:

- Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God who came to Earth to save humans from sin.
- His death and resurrection opened up the way back to God and restored humanity's relationship with Him.
- Jesus forgave many people as an example to His followers.
- Jesus taught The Lord's Prayer which asks God to grant the speaker forgiveness as they forgive others who have hurt them
