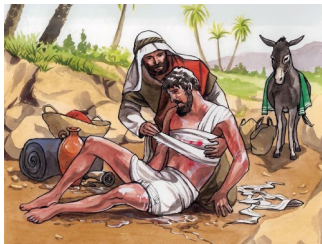




Key Questions

Key Skills Taught

Investigate: ask relevant questions; know how to use different types of sources as a way of gathering information.

Empathise: consider the thoughts, feelings, attitudes, beliefs and values of others; identify feelings such as love, wonder, forgiveness and sorrow ; see the world through others eyes.

VOCABULARY

Kind: generous, helpful, thinking about others.

Kindness: the quality of being kind.

Parable: a simple story that teaches a moral or religious idea.

Samaritan: a person from Samaria.

Samaria: central region of Israel.

Jewish Man: of Jewish descent.

Priest: a person who has trained to perform religious duties

Pharisee: a member of an ancient group of Jews who believed in obeying religious laws very carefully and who separated themselves from the ordinary people.

Levite: a legal expert (knows the Law)

Inn: a guesthouse

Forgive: to stop blaming or being angry with someone for something that person has done, or not punish them for something.

Compassion: a strong feeling of sympathy and sadness for the suffering or bad luck of others and a wish to help them.

Gospels: the first four books of the New Testament which record the life of Jesus.

Paralysed: someone who is unable to move.

Tradition: a belief, principle, or way of acting that people in a particular society or group have continued to follow for a long time.
