Key Skills Taught

Jesus: God the Son (God in human form) Friend of the friendless.

Gospel: The Teaching of Jesus

Disciples: The followers and friends of Jesus.

Tax Collector: A person that collects money for the Romans

Forgiveness: Not being mad when someone upsets you—forgetting it happened.

Neighbour: A person near to you.

Peace: No arguments or war.

Sacred: Set apart for God.

Pray: To talk to God (anytime, any place, anywhere)
